The Order of the Liturgy

The wedding liturgy is very similar to the Sunday Eucharist. Below you will find an outline of the wedding liturgy together with some possible options.

Introductory Rites

<u>Pre-service music</u> – instrumental and/or vocal solos <u>Processional music</u> – an instrumental or vocal solo, or hymn sung by all is appropriate for the procession with the Presider, bride, groom, parents and attendants

<u>The Greeting, and Opening Prayer</u> – When everyone is in their place, the Presider will welcome those who have gathered for this celebration and will invite them to pray.

Liturgy of the Word

1st Reading Responsorial Psalm 2nd Reading Gospel Homily

The Rite of Marriage

Following the homily the Presider will invite the bride and groom to stand and face each other in front of the whole assembly for the exchange of vows. The attendants will also come forward at this time. Please choose one of the two ways to say your vows, listed below. Following the exchange of vows there is a blessing and exchange of rings.

<u>Universal Prayers</u> are prayers for the needs of the Church, for public authorities and the salvation of the world, for the oppressed by any need, and for the local community. In the wedding liturgy intercessions may refer more specifically to the occasion, for the bride and groom and their families. Please choose from the following.

The he will bless their covenant as he chose to sanctify marriage at Cana in Galilee, let us pray to the Lord.

That they be granted perfect and fruitful love, Peace and strength, and that they bear faithful witness to the name of Christian, let us pray to the Lord.

That the Christian people may grow in virtue day by day and that all who are burdened by any need may receive the help of grace from above, let us pray to the Lord.

That the grace of the Sacrament will be renewed by the Holy Spirit in all married persons here present, let us pray to the Lord.

B For their relatives and friends, and for all who have assisted this couple, let us pray to the Lord.

For young people preparing to enter Marriage, and for all whom the Lord is calling to another state in life, let us pray to the Lord.

For all families throughout the world and for lasting peace among all people, let us pray to the Lord.

For all members of our families who have passed from this world, and for all the departed, let us pray to the Lord.

For the Church, the holy People of God, and for unity among all Christians, let us pray to the Lord.

Liturgy of the Eucharist (when there is Mass)

The Preparation of the Altar and Gifts The focus changes from proclaiming the Word of God and witnessing the exchange of your vows to sharing the Eucharist. The unity of the families and friends can be reflected in the presentation and preparation of the gifts. This may be done by the parents of the bride and groom, or other family members, or the bride and groom may decide to bring the bread and wine to the altar.

<u>The Eucharistic Prayer</u> will be chosen by the Presider and invite those gathered to participate with him in praising God, thanking Him for His goodness and remembering the Lord's death and resurrection. The Eucharistic acclamations (Holy, Holy, memorial acclamation, concluding acclamations) should be sung.

<u>The Communion Rite</u>— the Lord's Prayer follows the Eucharistic Prayer. The Lord's Prayer is meant to be the prayer of the entire congregation. It should not be sung as a vocal solo. A special nuptial blessing follows the Lord's Prayer. After this special wedding blessing, but before the congregation shares in the one bread and one cup, there is the sign of peace.

Little needs to be said of the beauty and power of the reception of communion by the couple. It is the presence of the Lord Himself. In Him you were baptized, and in Him you will become one flesh. He becomes an integral part of your love and marriage. He is the very foundation of your dignity; He is the essence of your love for each other; it is He who brought you together.

<u>Communion hymn</u> – During Holy Communion it is appropriate for all to sing a general Eucharistic song of thanks or unity.

<u>Flowers to Mary (optional)</u> Bringing flowers to Mary is done after Communion. This is often done to seek the guidance and blessings of the Lord, through a ceremony that requests the intercession (to request on your behalf) of the Blessed Virgin Mary, through prayer and the laying of flowers.

Concluding Rite

<u>The Blessing</u> Following Communion the Presider will invite all gathered to join with him in calling God's blessing upon you and upon your married life. Please choose one of the following:

May God the eternal Father keep you of one heart in love for one other, that the peace of Christ may dwell in you and abide always in your home.

May you be blessed in your children, have solace in your friends and enjoy true peace with everyone.

May you be witnesses in the world to God's charity, so that the afflicted and the needy who have known your kindness may one day receive you thankfully into the eternal dwelling of God.
