? Trouble Signing-in on the Chapel Kiosk? ?

The Chapel's sign-in kiosk relies on the parish router to connect to the internet and consequently AdorationPro software. If there is an electrical outage or if the router is inoperative for any reason, the kiosk wont work. Recently, there was a five hour period when Adorers were unable to sign-in through the kiosk.

What do we do if/when this happens in the future?

On the shelf below the kiosk is a folder with blank, *old fashion* paper registration forms. If you cannot sign-in, please start a paper registration sheet. Be sure the date and time are shown on the sheet so the information can be transferred later. Continue to use the paper registration only until the kiosk has reestablished connectivity to the internet and becomes usable.

The manual registration information will be added after the fact to AdorationPro and your time recorded so future usage reports will be accurate.

We are about 90% compliant with all regular Adorers electronically registering when they visit the Chapel. We hope everyone, including visitors, register through the Kiosk even if you are planning only a short visit.

Things To Keep In Mind During Adoration.

The following should be old hat to most Adorers. However, it may be a reminder to many and new considerations for others as to what is proper in the Chapel of the Holy Eucharist.

<u> Please</u>...

- ...Maintain silence.
- ...Open and close the door slowly and quietly when entering / leaving. The door is heavy and will slam shut loudly if you don't close it slowly. A slamming door interrupts others' meditation / prayer.
 - ...Similarly, if using the restroom, open and close the door quietly out of respect for others.
 - ...Quietly wipe snow and rain from your shoes on the entrance carpet. There is no need to stomp your feet.
- ...Adjust the air conditioner and fans quietly; make sure your adjustments are not adversely affecting others in the chapel. Quietly ask others if they mind if you make adjustments.
- ...Silence cell phones/pagers and don't use your cell phone. If you are "on call" through your business /profession and *must* answer a call, leave quietly and do so outside of the chapel.
 - ...Don't carry on conversations with others.
- ...Don't eat, drink, chew gum (just as if at Mass), but you may bring a bottle of water or cough drops if needed.
 - ...Dress appropriately and comfortably.
 - ...Don't *intentionally* sleep though some may doze off unintentionally.
- ...Don't conduct personal or professional business. *Don't* check email or text messages, do shopping lists, check or balance your checkbook, etc.
 - ... Take your preferred seat as quietly as possible.

On the positive side...

- ...Pray. Read spiritual books. Read Holy Scriptures. Pray the Rosary.
- ...Simply be quiet with Jesus. Talk to Jesus about anything on your mind or heart, problems, thanks for blessings.
 - ...Pray for the intentions of others. If it is your habit, maintain your spiritual journal.
