I have been told about & understand that a retreat is a required element of the process. If a serious problem arises regarding my attendance, I will contact the Youth Minister / Confirmation Coordinator (with sufficient advance notice) & to come to a resolution together.

I understand that if I have to miss a session I should contact the Youth Minister / Confirmation Coordinator as soon as I know about the scheduling issue and alternative options will be laid out.

If I miss a session, I will need to contact the Youth Minister / Confirmation Coordinator and discuss options to make up for the missed experience. This should be done within one week of the missed session.

I will do my best to pray every day to encourage my growth in and understanding of the Holy Spirit. Further, I will participate in Mass each week. I understand that doing so will help me celebrate more fully in the Sacrament of Confirmation.

I understand that the Confirmation preparation program is entered voluntarily. It is understood that those who attend do so because they want to. The parish will support you with the materials & information necessary for the preparation program

The program coordinators, catechists, teachers, parish staff and the parish community will pray for you & your fellow companions so that you may continue to grow in the power of the Holy Spirit.

My Hour with Jesus! Eucharistic Adoration

Jesus is truly present in the Blessed Sacrament. Eucharistic Adoration is an awesome way to get close to God, and to let Jesus heal us! A priest once said "the sin in our lives is like a cancer to our soul...and sitting before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament is the radiation for the soul." The Eucharist is the center of what separates Catholics from all other Christians, \mathcal{E} it is the "source \mathcal{E} summit" of our faith.

You are to join your candidate for 1 hour (minimum) of Eucharistic Adoration.

Immaculate Heart of Mary has Adoration in the chapel. The *Chapel of the Holy Eucharist*, located on the west side of the parish office building, is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week throughout the year! (*The code to enter the chapel is 5412*).



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Faith In Action / Service Project





Preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation includes participation in one or more service projects. As Catholics and as human beings we are called to live out the call of Confirmation to spread & proclaim the Catholic faith to all corners of the world. As John Paul II says, we are called to be "salt and light for the world." This faith is shared with & expressed to others not only in our daily lives of prayer & virtue, but also in the way we love those around us through our actions, our service, our commitment to bringing the light of the Gospel to people through all we do. As St. Francis says, "preach the Gospel at all times, & if you have to, use words." It's an important part of our call as Catholic Christians, & it helps our students realize they are truly needed & make a difference.

Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) 1889, 1926, 1932

■ This is the path of charity, that is, of the love of God & of neighbor. Charity is the greatest social
commandment. It respects others & their rights. It requires the practice of Justice, & it alone makes u
capable of it. Charity inspires a life of self-giving: "Whosoever seeks to gain his life will lose it, but
whoever loses his life will preserve it." (Luke 17:33)
■ The dignity of the human person requires the pursuit of the common good. Everyone should be
concerned to create & support institutions that improve the conditions of human life.
■ The duty of making oneself a neighbor to others & actively serving them becomes even more urgent
when it involves the disadvantaged, in whatever area this may be. "As you did it to the least of my
hrethren vou did it to me" (Mt 95:40)

Why do we have a service requirement?

- → The purpose of the service project is NOT to gain hours or points as a requirement for Confirmation. Service to others is an integral part of our call to live out our faith.
- \rightarrow The service project means to examine & live out our giftedness.
- → We are asked to live our faith and commitment to Jesus Christ by using our gifts & talents to serve others.
- → In the Gospel, we are called to feed the hungry, to comfort those in need, & to live a life of service to others (*Corporal & Spiritual Works of Mercy*).

Your service project should lead you to a greater desire to serve further, draw out virtues in your life, & ultimately bring you closer to God.

Requirements:

Each Confirmation candidate is required to complete a minimum of **1 act of service** in each of the following groups. There will NOT be a set number of hours. This requirement is designed for you to complete each act of service and reflect on the impact it had on your lives.

■ Parish ■ Local City & Community ■ Family

- ★ All projects must be in accord with Church teaching & unpaid.
- ★ Service projects should not be tasks that are ordinarily expected at home.
- ★ A Service Log must be kept. These are to be signed by the supervisor of the project & by parents. Once your Service Log is complete, please turn it in (with your reflective paper) to your religion teacher or catechist.
- ★ All service projects must be approved by your teacher, catechist, or Youth Minister. Please do not complete a project without having it approved.

Suggestions for Selecting Service Projects

- 1. *Pray about it*! Examine your own talents & gifts. Ask the Holy Spirit to guide you. Do not just seek the easy way out or the fastest way to finish.
- 2. *Challenge yourself & be creative*! Besides ongoing programs at school or locally, find new ideas to explore or share with others.
- 3. *Do not go at it alone!* Discuss this with your parents, sponsor, teacher, & friends. They are all good resources and support. You may want to put together a group project with your friends such as raking leaves for an elderly neighbor or praying for one of the Diocesan seminarians for a year.
- 4. Use the list! The list on the second page includes ideas & some contact information.
- 5. Do not stop service at 15 hours! It's OK to keep going. Part of the reason for the service hour requirement is that we are called to serve for the rest of our lives. You can continue your service project throughout the year. In addition, prayer & fasting is also a great spiritual work of mercy for others a great service!

CONFIRMATION SERVICE HOUR IDEAS:

- ★ Offer services to a neighbor or a friend, such as:
 - \circ gardening, mowing, shoveling, cleaning, or babysitting
- ★ Visit the sick or elderly in hospitals or nursing homes
- ★ Dedicate an hour to Forty Days for Life
- \bigstar Volunteer with Catholic Charities or Catholic Relief Services
- ★ Volunteer with HELP Pregnancy Crisis Aid
- ★ Prepare meals for shut-ins

- → Anything you are paid for
- → Responsibilities already expected of you i.e., household chores, altar serving, etc.

Saint Research Project

Choosing a patron Saint is an important part of the Confirmation preparation process. In the Roman Catholic Church, the sacrament of Confirmation is a sacrament of initiation. Once you have received the sacrament of Confirmation, you are considered an active adult in the Church. One aspect of receiving Confirmation is that you are asked to choose a saint for your Confirmation name. This new name signifies your change in status – you are now fully initiated into the Catholic faith. Further, the saint whose name you choose becomes a patron saint in your new endeavor to grow in the life of faith as an adult. To choose a saint's name for your Confirmation is not necessarily easy.

Saints are as unique & diverse as the rest of humanity. Although there are far more saints in heaven than there are canonized (official) saints, each canonized saint has a specific & individual path to sainthood which is intended to be an example to the rest of the Church. Read a general overview of the lives of the saints, or find a website which gives brief biographies of each saint. Does any saint's life story particularly appeal to or inspire you? This could be your Confirmation saint.

There are many saints who died or were martyred while they were children or teenagers. If you are being confirmed as a teenager, a youthful saint might be a good choice for your confirmation saint. For example, St. Agnes or St. Cecilia were both martyred as young women.

Do you have any serious hobbies or interests? If so, there is a patron saint for almost any hobby, interest, or sport. The patron saint of your favorite enthusiasm could be a good choice for your confirmation saint. For example, if you love learning, St. Thomas Aquinas could be a good saint. Or, if you prefer sports, St. Sebastian could be your patron.

Do you want to perfect a specific virtue in your life? There are saints who exemplify every virtue. For example, St. Maria Goretti is the patron saint of chastity.

Do you feel particularly called to married life, or to religious life? If so, there are saints who provide excellent examples of both vocations. If you feel drawn to married life, perhaps St. Joseph would be a good saint to choose. If you feel called to religious life, perhaps the founder of a religious order you are fond of would be a good choice (for example, St. Dominic or St. Benedict).


No matter who you choose, remember to pray to your Confirmation Saint often as you navigate your new life as an adult in the Church!

Final Interview





The final interview will be conducted by the Director of Religious Education or the Youth Minister. It is designed to gather a better understanding of you, check for your comprehension in the faith, why you desire to be confirmed, and how you plan to stay involved after you receive the Sacrament of Confirmation.

- 1. Interview your Sponsor with the following questions and record their responses:
 - a. Can you tell me about your Confirmation?
 - b. Who is your Confirmation Saint? What prompted you to choose this Saint?
 - c. Can you describe how the Holy Spirit is currently working in your life?
 - d. What would you like to see as I prepare for the Sacrament of Confirmation?
- 2. We have been taught that God set humans apart from all of creation, making them in His image and likeness. How does being made in His image and likeness impact you?
- 3. In the garden of Eden, God instructed the man that he may not eat from the tree of knowledge of good and evil, or he would die.
 - a. Read CCC #396 298. What did it mean for God to forbid the man to eat from the tree of knowledge of good and evil?
 - b. Read CCC 399-401. What were the consequences of disobeying this order?
 - c. Read CCC 402-404. How does "original sin" affect us?
- 4. Interview your mother or father and record their answers to the following questions:
 - a. Why did you want me to be baptized in the Catholic Church?
 - b. What led to your decision to choose my Godparents?
 - c. What is something you remember from that day?
- 5. Read CCC #1212. What are three sacraments of initiation?
- 6. Read CCC #1422. What are the two sacraments of healing?
- 7. Read CCC #1534. What are the two sacraments of service?



- 8. Read (CCC #1324). What does it say about the Eucharist?
- 9. Read CCC# 2041-2043. What are the 5 Precepts of the Church?
- 10. Visit the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops Website at www.usccb.org. Do a search for "Holy days of Obligation". List all the Holy Days of Obligation and the dates.
- 11. What are the two sacraments you can receive every day?
- 12. What are the Mass and Confession times at Immaculate Heart of Mary Catholic Church?
- 13. Read CCC #44 & 45.
 - a. Take time to pray and reflect on this reading.
 - b. Write down what you think this is telling you.
- 14. In what way will you continue your faith formation after Confirmation?
- 15. What gifts and talents do you have that could benefit Immaculate Heart of Mary parish?
